## Maurice's Musings

Read 2 Peter 3:3-4. The short letters near the end of the New Testament are often overlooked. They shouldn't be; they have an important message.

The question posed in these verses comes four hundred years after the end of the Old Testament record. Yet it must surely have been the very question on the minds of all those who, in the meantime, eagerly looked forward to the coming of the promised Messiah. When would He appear? How long must they wait for the kingdom He would establish? Why was God so silent and slow?

We ourselves can identify with many of the same questions. Now that Christ has come and promised to return, when will He come again? How long must we wait?

Having revealed Himself in the person of Jesus and in the inspired Scripture of the New Testament, why is God still so silent? The problem is only intensified when their four hundred years has now turned into our two millennia. Although many in succeeding generations have been convinced that Christ would come in their lifetime (even publishing dates), so far those believers have lived and died only in expectation, not fulfillment. Christ will indeed come in some generation's lifetime, but it may not be our own.

Pastor Harold Camping of Oakland, California predicted the Second Coming would take place last month on May 21<sup>st</sup> at about 6:00 pm (PST). Mr. Camping convinced many people to quit their jobs and drive around America warning people of the end of the world. When it didn't happen, he decided he had miscalculated. According to Mr. Camp it will be this December.

So how do we deal with such delay? Become cynical and give up our faith? Become obsessed with signs of an imminent coming, even if they prove to be wrong yet again? Of one thing we can be sure: no matter how long it takes, CHRIST IS COMING AGAIN! How do we know? Because, despite the long delay between the two Testaments, Christ did indeed appear, precisely as promised. Just as surely, we too can count on His glorious reappearing. It may not be in our lifetime, but it certainly could be. And the mortality rate for this world is 100%.

Ask yourself this important question: if Christ should suddenly appear even today, would I be ready? People die every day - they don't have to worry about the end of the world. It ended for them already.

### EFFECTUAL PRAYER

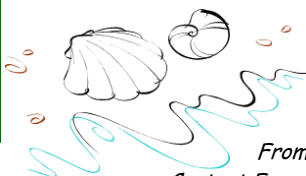
How can our prayers become effectual?

If our prayers are merely words directed at God, they are—well, merely words.

What we pray for must first be already begun in ourselves. If we would pray for peace, we must already be peacemakers. If we would have forgiveness, we must already be forgiving.

Some are so advanced as to pray for their enemies. To make this effectual we must first consider: has my enemy something against me? Am I willing to amend that offense of mine so that we may be reconciled? It is no use to pray for our enemies if we are looking down upon them.

Our actions must go in the line of our prayers. It would baffle anyone—even God—to hear someone say, "I am coming toward you" who all the while was walking in the opposite direction. "Your prayers *and* your alms have ascended as a memorial before God."

### LORD, SHUT MY MOUTH!

One of my ongoing prayers is for the strength to curb my tongue and not offer my marvelous insights on everything. This does not mean that I must always be silent, but it does mean that I must listen and be sensitive to the needs and feelings of other people before I speak. Most especially, it means that I am called to listen, prayerfully and attentively, for the voice of God.

Norvene Vest in *No Moment Too Small* says that "before we speak, we can choose silence and then look honestly at what the urge to speak is telling us about ourselves." That is good advice.

Must I have an opinion on everything? If I do have an opinion, must I belabor it? Is that clever retort necessary? Will my speech hurt someone? Am I really listening to my friend, my partner, my children? Do I ask or demand too much? Am I content to sit silently in God's presence and listen instead of always asking? God speaks to us in the silence within us. I must guard against blocking out God's voice with the noise of my own voice.

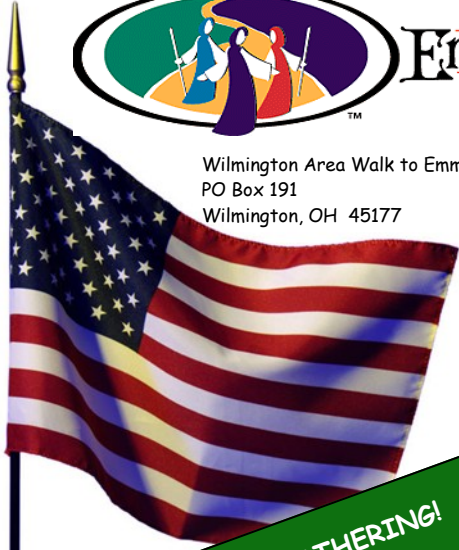
