Blossoms from Bloom

Today I declare,
**"No more
cover-ups!"**

Beloved,

I have been enjoying a study through World Changers Church entitled, "Was I Born This Way?" The study is taken from Exodus 20:5 that reads: "*You shall not bow down to them or worship them; for I the Lord your God am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those that hate me.*"

The Israelites had just come from Egypt where it was common practice to worship many gods. The people had become actively engaged in the practice of the Egyptian culture because they, too, wanted to maximize the number of blessings they could receive. But God wanted them to worship the **one** true God...**Him**. Thus, the number one commandment given to us, "**You shall have no other gods before me.**" Exodus 20:3

In the study it talks about the iniquities (sins) of families that are passed down from one generation to another. They gave examples of hand-me-down sins: alcoholism, drugs, cursing, gambling, pornography, sexual and verbal abuse, pre-marital sex, laziness, overeating, gossiping, explosive temperament to name a few. These don't look like gods, but any sin that we willingly allow to live within us and grow becomes a god that stands be-

tween us and our Father. We like to think that these sins are in our DNA...things that cannot be altered because they are "in" us. We like to push fault off onto other people to try to justify **why we are the way we are** and **why we do the things we do**. But, in reality, the opportunity to choose freedom from these sins lies within us and to shift blame toward other people becomes nothing more than a charade of cover-ups.

Let me give you an example. Adam and Eve ate the fruit from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil that God **warned** them not to eat. We know the story...after eating the fruit they realized they were naked, they clothed themselves the best they could, then hid from God. When God questioned them, Adam blamed it on Eve. And Eve blamed it on the serpent. "**Cover Up!**" Bottom line, *they both* knew the right thing to do... and *they both* chose not to do it.

God gives us the freedom to make the right choice for every decision we face in our lives. He has given to us the bible so we can know the boundaries where goodness and peace abide. All we have to do is **read** The Word of God, and be **doers** of the Word. In doing so, our minds are renewed and our actions are kept in check. We say, "I don't like to read and I don't have time." **Cover up!** There are CD's/tapes of the bible for your car. Get the Word of God in your wheels. You will drive the Adversary right out of your life!

As Exodus 20 :5 permeated my thoughts I questioned myself. *Do I have other God's before me? Has*

God been talking to me trying to warn me of certain situations that could be harmful to me? Am I tangled in the weight of iniquity that could become a pattern for the lives of my children or grandchildren?

For all of my life I have battled with weight issues. I weighed in at thirty pounds at age one. My Grandma Mac lovingly nicknamed me "*her little fatty*" when I was in elementary school. I always liked to think that she truly knew my real name! :o~

I can't tell you how many times in my life I've tipped the scales to "red alert zone" and then worked like a mad dog to get that weight back off. When I reached "**over the hill status**" I decided to give up on being my ideal weight. I chose to think that being over weight was just in my DNA. My mother is round, her mother was round, and her mother's mother was round. It was just the way I was going to be. But, to be truthful, **that's just a cover-up!** I am over weight because **that** is what I choose.

You know, God is a very good communicator if we will listen to Him. And, He makes himself known when we are sensitive to His ways.

I have a precious little granddaughter whose name is Magarah. She is a little angel, so very honest and transparent in her conversation with me. One day she asked me, "*Ma, when are you going to get flat?*" I asked her, "What

TABOR TALK

Don't anticipate.....
but expect the unexpected!

There is a phrase that has been repeated on every Emmaus walk or Chrysalis flight with which I have ever been involved. That phrase is simple: "Don't anticipate!" That phrase is used on those occasions to encourage the participants to not be caught unaware when they find themselves in situations which expand their boundaries of comfort, where they find themselves not sure exactly how to respond to the idiosyncrasies and details of the weekend. But the same encouragement could be given to us in every arena of life, not just Emmaus.

A young preacher was invited to a small country church for services. It was summer and the church had no air conditioning so all of the doors and windows were open. Everything was going fine and the young preacher was doing well until he walked a skunk. The skunk paraded right down the aisle towards the pulpit. The young preacher noticed the skunk. He cautiously looked around the church for reactions from the congregation.

To his surprise no one else seemed to even notice the skunk. Uneasily the preacher decided to ignore the skunk and keep preaching. The skunk kept on moving toward the front of the church. The preacher managed to continue focused on preaching until the skunk reached the platform and headed for the pulpit. The young preacher scanned the audience for some sort of reaction. Surely, he thought, someone in the congregation had noticed the skunk.

The audience appeared attentive but yet oblivious to the dilemma of the young preacher. The skunk moved closer to the preacher. Finally, the time for action had arrived and the preacher decided he had to do something. He vaulted over the pulpit and ran out the back door!

Once outside he took a few moments to catch his breath as he waited for others to follow. Several minutes passed and no one else came out of the church. He decided to check out the situation. Cautiously he approached the door and peaked inside. What he saw amazed him, the congregation was still seated as if nothing had happened.

Finally, one of the deacons walked out of the church holding the skunk. By this time the young preacher was extremely nervous and very confused. The deacon looked at the preacher, held up the skunk and said, "I guess we should have told you about the neighbor's pet skunk. He occasionally comes to visit."

That young preacher was never the same after that!

Every preacher has some story that could compare with that one in some way or another. But awkward situations are not the express territory of preachers. As well, pushing people out of their comfort zones is not confined to current living environments. In fact, one cannot read the Gospels without realizing that stretching exercises were regular activities for Jesus with His disciples. He seemed to constantly be pushing out the walls of comfort for those would-be followers in the first century. His challenges to them included feeding a lot of hungry people with little to no resources, calming their anxious hearts on the Sea of Galilee when they were "in over their heads." He also challenged those who were not in his corner with things like healing on the Sabbath. (Is anyone else besides me amazed that the Jewish leaders were more upset about his "working" on the Sabbath than they were in awe that he actually healed someone?) In short, for the disciples, the one thing they could be absolutely sure of when they were with Jesus is that the walls of their traditional "boxes" would be consistently pushed outward through unusual and unique experiences. The one question that they asked with a great regularity was, "What sort of man is this?" The disciples time and again had to re-think and modify their conception of who He was and what He could do.

Our concept of God is too small. We think He is someone who is to be confined to Sunday morning or to only the obviously "spiritual" situations in life - like weddings and funerals and births and baptisms and the like, even Emmaus weekends! But God is in the business of disintegrating that vision that we have of Him. He attempts to drive us to see Him as a God who is in the business of working in our lives on a daily basis, of not just being a "Sunday School God."

Now that may sound good, but how do we accomplish that? How do we expand our vision of a God who is good for Sunday only? I cannot get over the fact that we do that by "fixing our eyes on Jesus" (Hebrews 12:1-2). These verses show us that we should expect the unexpected when it comes to God. Because it is unexpected, we should then keep our eyes on Him! God desires our focused attention every day of our lives. In His own creative way, He promises that our concentration will never fail to be rewarded. We should never try to put God in a box, to make Him predictable. When we do, He will do something very unusual, like sending a pet de-odorized skunk down the center aisles of our lives. When that happens, He calls us not to panic, but to continue to trust and depend and focus on Him. And the aroma will be sweet! (Hebrews 13:15-16). Start focusing on Him.... today!


